Role of CSSD in the hospital

Cornerstone in the strategy of infection control

CSSD = support of all the health care activities of a facility

Surgery stops within 48h when CSSD is not running

CSSD is the heart of hospital

Our role

- Provide Reusable Medical Devices (RMD) clean and sterile (or disinfected)
- Repeatedly
- For 100% of the reprocessed ReMD
 To guarantee the patient's safety



Our objectives

- Put patient first
- Do everything not to add an extra risk to the surgery or care

What is the current situation?

- The practices are varied
- Some examples:
 - Parametric release and qualification vs use of BI/CI (2 worlds)
 - Steam sterilisation program (134°c 3/18 min, 132°C...)
 - Qualified Washer disinfectors vs manual cleaning
 - Packing materials
 - Expiry time

Why different guidelines?

- Local conditions:
 - involvement of Health Care Authorities,
 - Awareness of the issue of decontamination (prevention's policy)
 - Finances
 - Habits Authors/orientation
